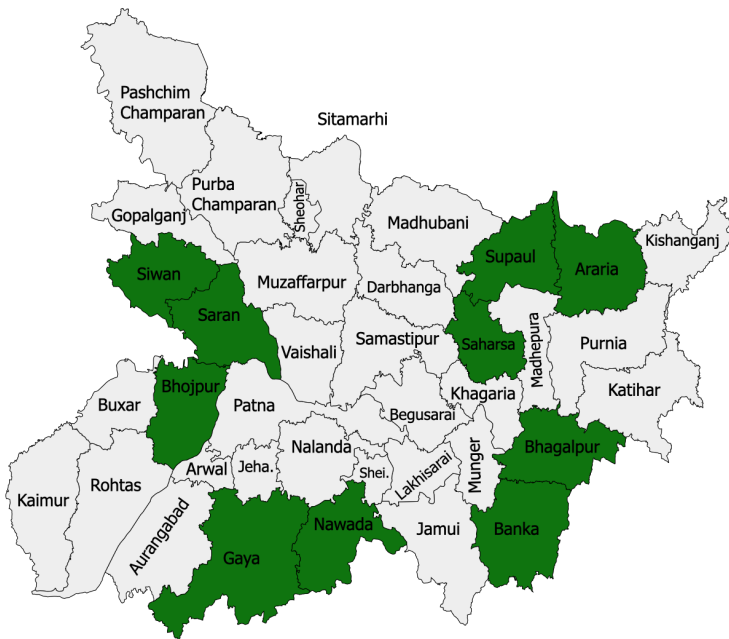
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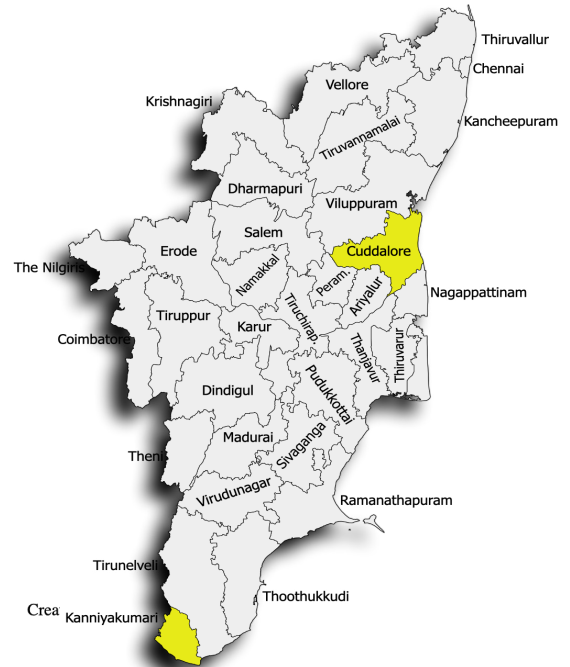

TAMIL NADU

India has the highest burden of TB with two deaths occurring every three minutes from tuberculosis (TB). But these deaths can be prevented. Through proper care, treatment, and awareness, TB can be cured, and the preventable disease can be eliminated.

From 2006 to 2017, ADRA India actively worked towards the elimination of Tuberculosis. The organization initiated the **“Treatment for One, Prevention for All”** Project (2006-2009), funded by ADH (Adventist Development and Health). Its main goal was to raise comprehensive community awareness about the risks associated with TB. The project contributed to the reduction of the burden of TB among the tsunami-Affected coastal communities of Cuddalore and Kanyakumari districts of Tamil Nadu.









In 2008, ADRA India launched the **“TB Jumpstart”** Initiative (2008-2010) in Bihar, supported by USAID (United States Agency for International Development). This effort, carried out through a consortium, focused on advocacy, communication, and mobilization of communities through local organizations in Bihar state.

ADRA India’s commitment to Bihar persisted through the Global Fund’s **“Axshya India”** Project, the first phase of which started in 2010. The project subsequently reached a second phase (2015-2017). Providing significant support to the RNTCP (Revised National Tuberculosis Control Program) across 10 districts, ADRA India engaged in Active Case Search, collaboration with Qualified Private Providers, CBOs (Community-Based Organizations) / FBOs (Faith-Based Organizations), and HIV TB (Human Immunodeficiency Virus Tuberculosis) positive networks. The goal was to enhance Case Detection and Reporting rates, thus reducing mortality and morbidity rates. This comprehensive approach aimed to strengthen the TB situation in the state through increased TB Notifications from both Public and Private Health Systems and ACSM (Advocacy, Communication, and Social Mobilization) activities.



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
